The committee was presented with a sub-committee report, prepared by Kathleen Ganley and John Rhodes, on physical therapy and acupuncture education. The objectives of this report was to review entry level requirements for both PT and Acupuncture educational programs, review continuing education and competency requirements in both professions, review available dry needling curriculum. A copy of the entire report is available upon request.

The committee discussed the continuing education process used by the Arizona Physical Therapy Association. In addition, Sara Demeure provided the committee with a listing of dry needling continuing education providers.

Patricia Martin shared her thoughts on the book "The Yellow Emperor's Classic of Medicine" (Chapter 77) which is a highly readable narrative for students—as well as for everyone curious about the underlying principles of Chinese medicine. All the subjects are discussed in a holistic context that says life is not fragmented, as in the model provided by modern science, but rather that all the pieces make up an inter-connected whole. By revealing the natural laws of this holistic universe, the book offers much practical advice on how to promote a long, happy, and healthy life.
